Passwords (Continued)

By now you will have studied the passwords 1-10 and recognised some key features. Now let's look at the passwords more closely...

Passwords 1-3 - these passwords highlight the interests of the person and will be commonly used.

Passwords 4-6 - these passwords are sequential, which means they are in a sequence.

Passwords 7 and 8 - these passwords are obvious.

Passwords 9 and 10 - these passwords include obvious substitutions for letters. E.g. o - 0 and s - 5

To create a secure password, stay away from examples similar to the ones shown. Now, let's look at a password below to see if you can identify some key features of a strong password...

Strong Password 1: 8 3 0 f ? ! r u Y T P 4 x 1

This password includes many features that considers it strong although it isn't easily remembered. Now have a look at the one below...

Strong Password 2: MfciaFbic£249,950

My <u>favourite car is a Ferrari but it costs £ 2 4 9</u>, 9 5 0

I created a mnemonic so I could remember my password.
